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Report Context

Much of this report was compiled with enrollment data pulled from the Colorado Department of Education and population data compiled from the American Community Survey and U.S. Census Bureau.

General Information about D11 School District

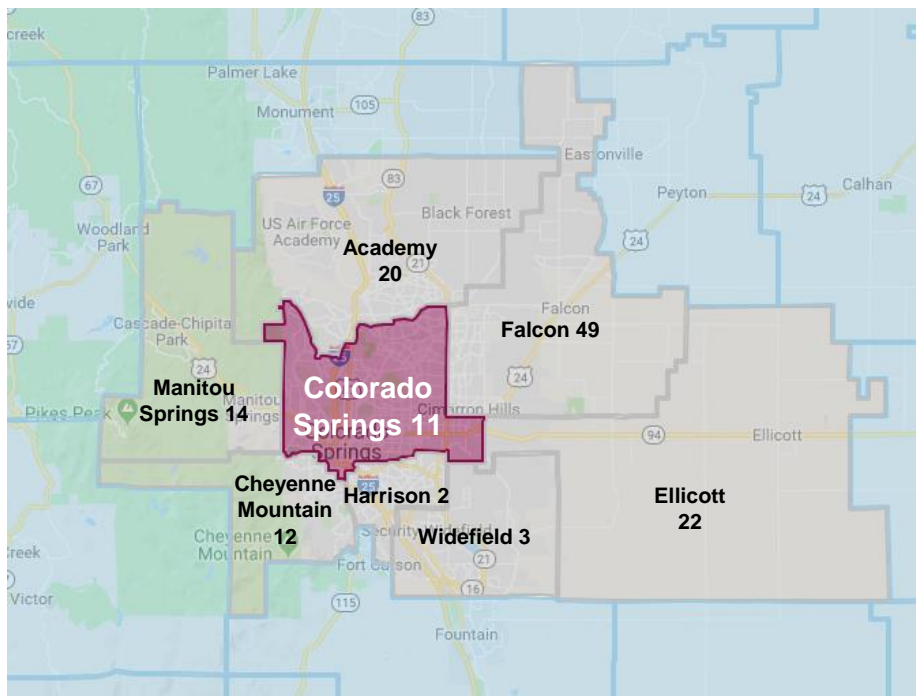
Colorado Springs 11 (D11) is located in El Paso County, in the Pikes Peak region of the state. The city of Colorado Springs is the major metropolitan area located in D11. The map below shows the geographic boundaries of the D11 (outlined in red).

D11 covers 72 square miles in El Paso County, including the city of Colorado Springs. D11 is highlighted on the map in red.

Adjacent school districts in El Paso County (highlighted in grey) include Academy 20, Falcon 49, Ellicott 22, Widefield 3, Harrison 2, Cheyenne Mountain 12, and Manitou Springs 14.

There are a total of 66 schools* within D11 district boundaries, including ten schools authorized by the Colorado Charter School Institute (CSI), six charter schools authorized by D11, and five Alternative Education Campuses (AECs). **Appendix A** has the full list of school choices in D11.

*In Colorado, the number of schools is calculated according to the number of school codes associated with each contract. School codes are assigned, upon requests of the authorizer, as a school begins operating.

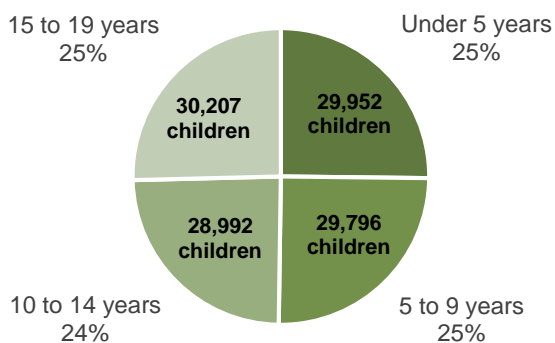
Population Characteristics

School Aged Children

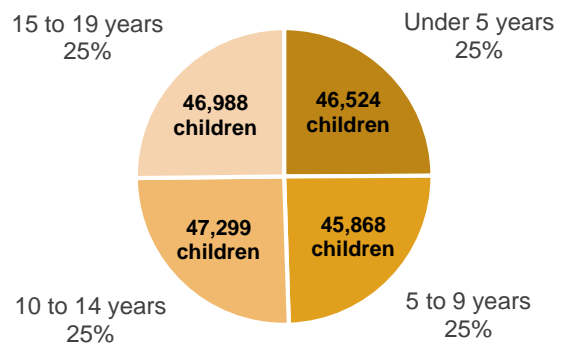
The below information captures the number and percent of school aged children in the city of Colorado Springs and El Paso County. The most recent data available is from the American Community Survey (ACS), which is collected and released by the U.S. Census Bureau. This dataset was released in 2017 and includes summarized responses from 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2016 for the city of Colorado Springs and El Paso County.

The 2017 ACS found that age distribution of school aged children for the city of Colorado Springs and El Paso County is relatively even. For Colorado Springs, children under 5 years old, children 5 to 9 years old, children 10 to 14 years old, and children 15 to 19 years old each represented around 25% of the total population of school aged children. Results for El Paso County also found that children under 5 years old, children 5 to 9 years old, children 10 to 14 years old, and children 15 to 19 years old each represented 25% of the total population of school aged children.

School Aged Children in CO Springs (2017 ACS)








School Aged Children in El Paso County (2017 ACS)

These results show that the population of school aged children in Colorado Springs and El Paso County has continually increased. While all age ranges saw similar growth in population, the largest increase for Colorado Springs and El Paso County is the high school age range (15 to 19 years old), from 15,828 children to 30,207 15 to children (17.0% increase from the 2000 Census) in Colorado Springs and from 38,708 children to 46,988 children (21.4% increase from the 2000 Census) in El Paso County.

Enrollment

Total Student Enrollment over Time

The number of students attending D11 has decreased by nearly 7% over the past five years (from 28,332 students in 2014-15 to 26,395 students in 2018-19). For schools authorized by CSI in D11, student enrollment has increased nearly 70% over the past five years (from 2,385 students in 2014-15 to 4,012 students in 2018-19). The schools that saw the largest increases in enrollment include Global Village Academy – Colorado Springs (opened in 2013-14) with a 40% increase in enrollment and Thomas MacLaren School (opened in 2009-10) with a 140% increase in enrollment. Thomas MacLaren expanded to add an elementary school program for the 2018-19 school year which added nearly 350 students to their total student enrollment numbers and was a large contributing factor to this boom in growth.

Adjacent districts to D11 (marked below in italics) are Academy 20, Cheyenne Mountain 12, Ellicott 22, Falcon 49, Harrison 2, Manitou Springs 14, and Widefield 3. These districts have seen a 7% increase over the past five years, with all districts seeing population increases of over 2% and Falcon 49 seeing the largest percent increase of nearly 15%. Total enrollment values for all the school districts in El Paso County can be seen in the table below.




Enrollment by Grade Level over Time

Student enrollment for D11 schools have decreased overall and at every grade level over the past five years.




The largest decrease in student enrollment is for Pre-Kindergarten through 5th grades, with a 9% decrease. This mirrors the trend in U.S. Census and ACS data from 2010 to 2017, which saw the smallest population increases for school aged children in the 5 to 9 years old age range. The smallest decrease in student enrollment is for 6th through 8th grades, with a 3% decrease. High school grades 9th through 12th mirrored overall district trends with a 6% decrease in enrollment.

For schools authorized by CSI in D11, student enrollment has the opposite overall trends. All grade levels have seen increases in enrollment over the past five years.

The largest increase in student enrollment is for Pre-Kindergarten through 5th grades (from 1,503 students in 2014-15 to 2,214 in 2018-19, 47.3%). The smallest increase in student enrollment for schools authorized by CSI in D11 was at the high school level, with a 30% increase over the past five years (from 789 students in 2014-15 to 1,028 students in 2018-19).

One factor that has an impact on the change in overall enrollment over time is the closure and transfer of schools authorized by CSI in D11. Colorado Calvert Academy served grades Kindergarten through 8th and transferred in 2014-15 and Pikes Peak Prep served grades Kindergarten through 12th and was closed in 2017-18. By removing enrollment values for these schools, schools authorized by CSI in D11 have increased enrollment by more than 68% over the last five years overall (from 2,074 students in 2014-15 to 4,012 students in 2018-19).

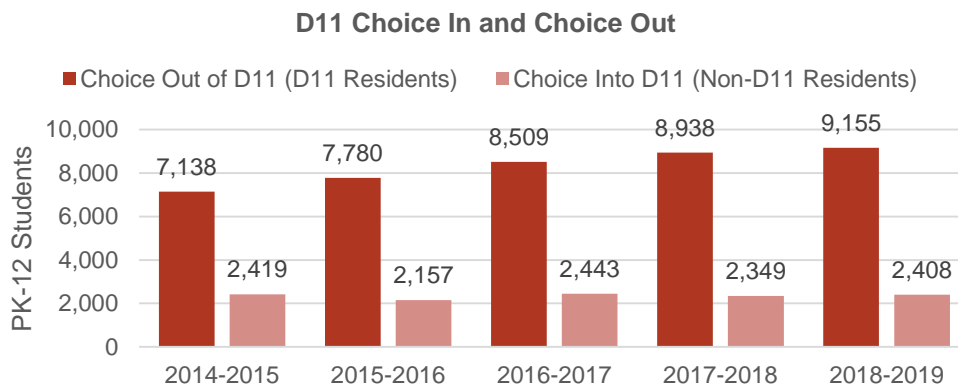

Choice Into and Out of D11

D11 Choice

The number of students who live in D11 and choice out of D11 has increased from 7,138 students in 2014-2015 to 9,155 in 2018-2019, a choice out increase of 28.3% (these values include those students choosing into schools authorized by CSI in D11). The number of students who live outside of D11 and choice into D11 has decreased from 2,419 students in 2014-15 to 2,408 students in 2018-19, a choice in decrease of 0.5%.

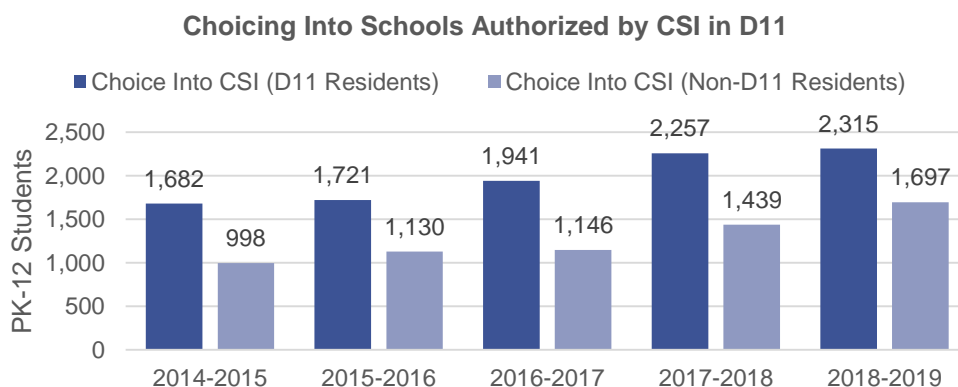

Choice Into Schools Authorized by CSI in D11

The number of students who live in D11 and choice into schools authorized by CSI in D11 has increased from 1,682 students in 2014-15 to 2,315 students in 2018-19, a choice in increase of 38%. The number of students who live outside of D11 and choice into schools authorized by CSI in D11 has also increased from 998 students in 2014-15 to 1,697 students in 2018-19, a choice in increase of 70%.

WHAT DOES “CHOICE” MEAN IN THIS CONTEXT?

These values show D11 and non-D11 residents who attend *any* school, including charters or non-charters. Below is an explanation of each group on the graphs:

Choice Out of D11: D11 residents that choose to attend *any* non-D11 school, including schools authorized by CSI in D11.

Choice Into D11: Non-D11 residents that choose to attend *any* D11 school over a school in their local district.

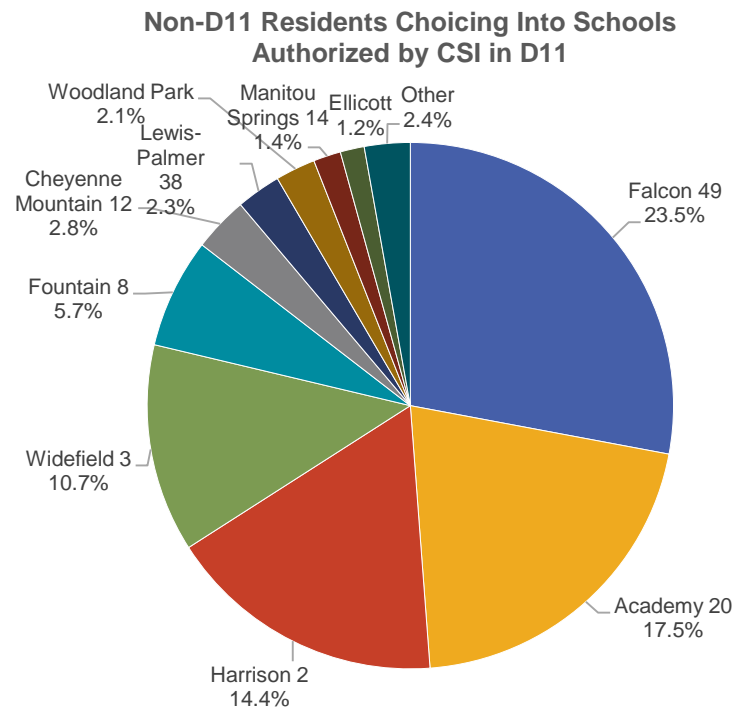
Choice Into CSI: D11 and non-D11 residents that choose to attend schools authorized by CSI in D11 over their local district schools.

Non-D11 Residents Choicing Into Schools Authorized by CSI in D11

The non-D11 residents that are choicing into schools authorized by CSI in D11 (light blue bar on the graph on the previous page) come from the following school districts in 2018-19:



Pie Chart of Non-D11 Residents Choicing Into CSI (N=1,424^{***})

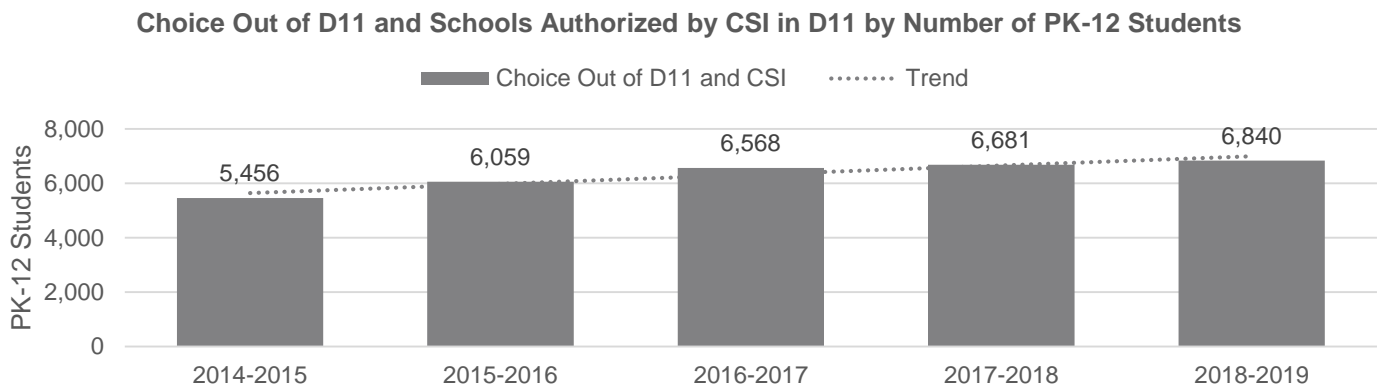
The largest percent of non-D11 residents attending schools authorized by CSI in D11 come from Falcon 49 (23.5%), followed by Academy 20 (17.5%), and Harrison 2 (14.4%). All three school districts are adjacent to D11. Both Falcon 49 and Academy 20 are north of Colorado Springs, while Harrison 2 is south.

12.7% of non-D11 residents choicing into CSI come from non-adjacent school districts, including Fountain 8 (5.7%), Lewis-Palmer 38 (2.3%), and Woodland Park (2.1%). Both Woodland Park and Lewis-Palmer are north of Colorado Springs and Fountain 8 is directly south of Harrison 2.

^{***}These values use the parent's district of residence column in October Count. Due to reporting errors, Monarch Classical School of the Arts' 273 students are not included in these percentages.

Choice Out of D11 and CSI

The previous page showed how a growing number of D11 residents are choicing out of D11 and, at the same time, a growing number of D11 residents are choicing into schools authorized by CSI in D11. The chart below shows the population of D11 residents that choose to attend neither D11 schools nor schools authorized by CSI in D11.



The values above show a 25% increase over the past five years of D11 residents choicing schools outside of the district in which they live, an increase from 5,456 students in 2014-15 to 6,840 students in 2018-19.

Choice Districts

Below are the top five districts for each of the past five years that D11 residents are choosing to attend, instead of attending a D11 school or schools authorized by CSI in D11. This list is ordered from the greatest to least. Values in the parentheses are total n counts, by number of PK-12 students.

The largest percentage of D11 residents attending schools outside of D11 geographic boundaries are attending Academy 20 schools consistently each year. The other top ranking districts include Falcon 49, Harrison 2, Cheyenne Mountain 12, and Manitou Springs (ordered from largest to smallest). All five of these districts are adjacent to Colorado Springs.

Charter Schools and Home-Based Education

Charter Schools in D11










There are six charter schools authorized by D11, two of which are also Alternative Education Campuses (Community Prep Charter School and East Lake High School). Three of the D11 charter schools have an elementary school, one has a middle school, and three have a high school. As a whole, charter schools authorized by D11 have seen a 6% decrease in enrollment since 2014-15. Three would be rated Performance with Distinction under the CSI rating system, the highest rating for CSI. The only school with a rating below Performance is East Lake High School, an Alternative Education Campus who was evaluated using the AEC School Performance Framework. Below is a list of charter schools in D11:

Eight out of the ten schools authorized by CSI in D11 have an elementary school, seven have a middle school, and four have a high school. As a whole, enrollment is increasing over the past five years. However, enrollment trends for Colorado Springs Charter Academy (opened in 2005-06) is decreasing. Colorado Springs Charter Academy has seen overall decreasing enrollment over the past five years, with a slight incline in 2015-16. Only one CSI school has a performance rating lower than the two highest ratings of Performance or Performance with Distinction, Colorado Military Academy (opened in 2017-18) with a rating of Improvement.

Home-Based Education

The number of students enrolled in full time home based education has decreased over the past five years by 23%. In 2015-16, there was an increase in the number of families choosing home based education (from 559 students in 2014-15 to 859 students in 2015-16), however, by 2018-19, this value decreased by 50%. Out of all D11 enrollment in 2018-19, less than 2% of students use home based education.

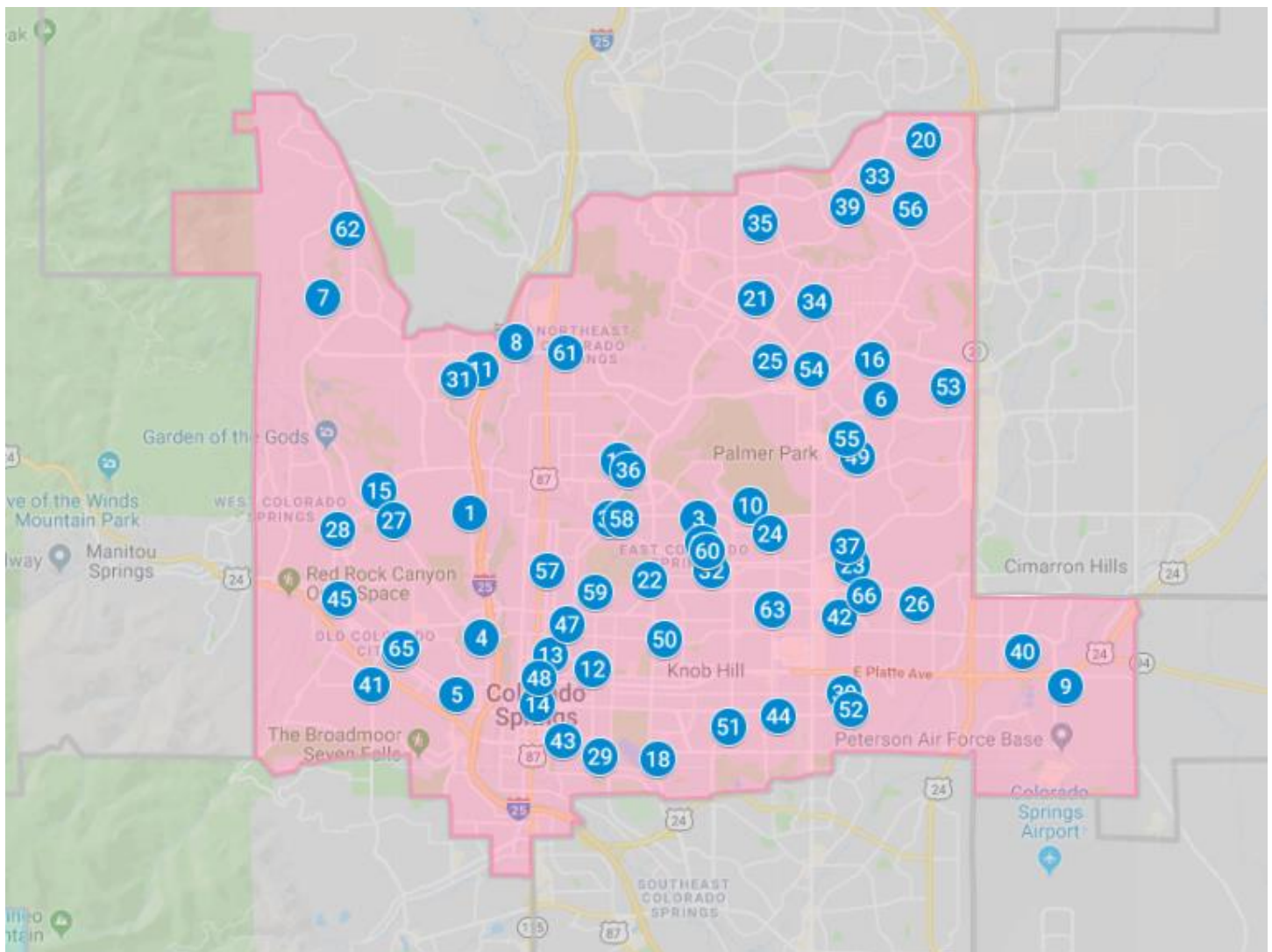

Below is a map that contains all the schools located in D11. Schools authorized by CSI in D11 are numbers 9 (Colorado Military Academy), 10 (Colorado Springs Charter Academy), 11 (Colorado Springs Early College), 14 (Coperni 3), 23 (Global Village Academy – Colorado Springs), 32 (James Irwin Charter Academy), 36 (Launch High School), 43 (Monarch Classical School of the Arts), 45 (Mountain Song Community School), 61 (Thomas MacLaren School). D11 charter schools are numbers 1 (Academy for Advanced and Creative Learning), 8 (CIVA Charter Academy), 13 (Community Prep Charter School), 18 (East Lake High School), 24 (Globe Charter School), and 52 (Roosevelt Edison Charter School). **Appendix A** has a full list of school names, along with their corresponding map number.

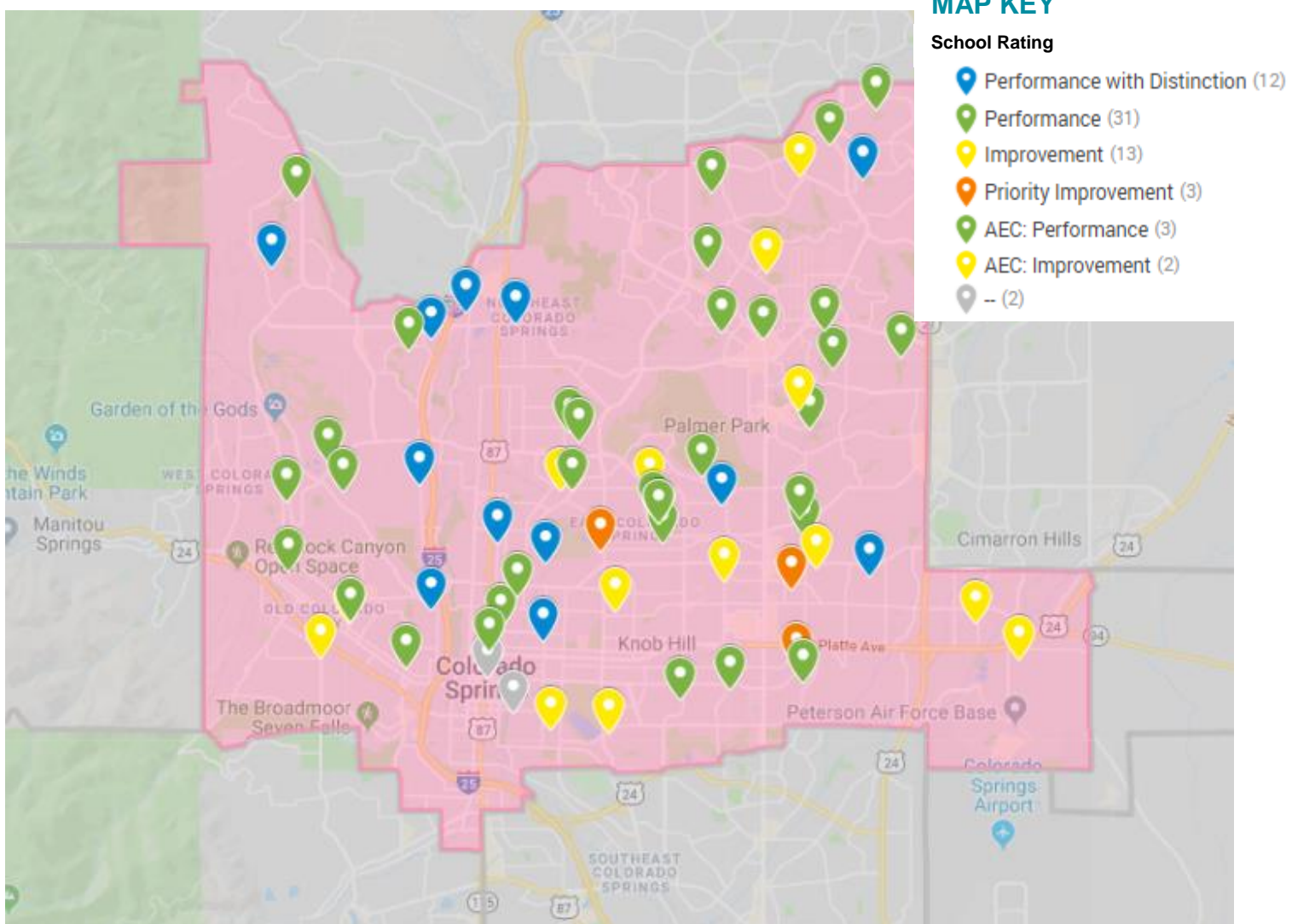

Map of 2018 Statewide Percentile Rank

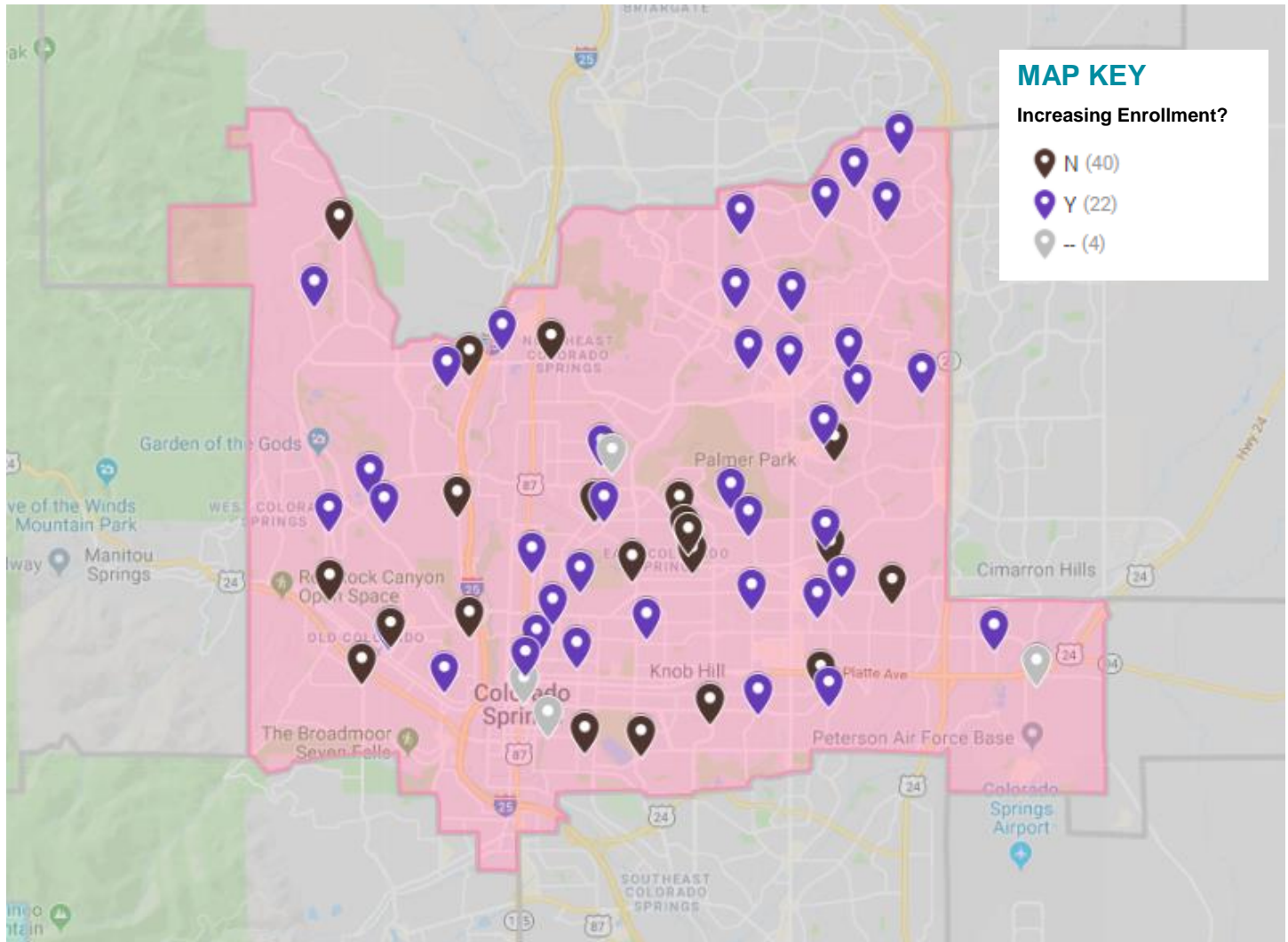
This map uses calculated percentiles for each school based on their total percent of points earned on the School Performance Framework. To do this, each school's total percent of points earned on the achievement, growth, and postsecondary workforce readiness sections of the School Performance Framework was compared to all the other schools across the state. Each school then received a percentile based on their performance. Schools above CSI's "Performance with Distinction" rating threshold (72.8 percent of points) received a distinction rating, coded as blue. Performance is coded as green, improvement as yellow, priority improvement as orange, turnaround as red, and no value as grey.

70% of schools in D11 are rated as the top two performance ratings for academics (a total of 46 schools). 18.5% of schools in D11 would be considered Performance with Distinction under CSI's rating system, placing them in the top 25% of schools in Colorado. Two of these Performance with Distinction schools are CSI schools: Colorado Springs Early College (#11) and Thomas MacLaren School (#61). 29.2% of schools in D11 are rated Improvement or below (a total of 19 schools). Of those, three are rated as Priority Improvement, the second lowest state rating. Those three schools are Galileo School of Math and Science (#22), Jack Swigert Aerospace Academy (#30), and Mitchell High School (#42), all are non-charter schools. The map below contains all the schools in D11. Any schools that have decreased their enrollment size from 2014-15 to 2018-19 are marked as “N” on the map. Schools with increasing enrollment are marked as “Y”. As shown in the map below, 65% of schools have decreasing enrollment over the past five years in D11.
