Colorado Early Colleges Colorado Springs

Colorado Early Colleges Colorado Springs (CECCS), which has offered an early college education to high school students since 2007, will complete the addition of a middle school for the 2021-22 year. It will be the network's first middle school in southern Colorado.

As school leader Jennifer Daugherty <u>shared earlier this year</u>: "The CECCS middle school program will be a unique model that focuses on building student skills in all areas of their life: academics, social-emotional, wellbeing, and resiliency. We firmly believe that this approach will help meet the needs of students and families in the Colorado Springs and surrounding areas as we aspire to fulfill our mission and help students succeed in school, in college, and in their chosen career."

CECCS was also recently approved to begin offering online programming. The CEC Online Programs are fully-online offerings for students in grades 6-12 that "aim to deliver the same great support and skill-based programming our on-campus students experience in our middle school and high school campuses."

"CSI schools in Colorado Springs are responding to community need," shared CSI Executive Director Dr. Terry Croy Lewis. "We are proud of the work these schools are doing and the value they provide to families."
